REVISIONS TO INVITATION TO BID (ITB)

**REVISION 1** – Add the following to ITB, section II:

**21. Protest of Award.**

- A. A Proposer may protest the Intent to Award, provided:
- (1) The Proposer is adversely affected because the Proposer would be eligible to be awarded the contract in the event that the protest is successful; and
  - (2) The reason for the protest is:
    - (a) All higher-ranked proposals are non-responsive;
    - (b) The District has failed to conduct the evaluation of proposals in accordance with the criteria or processes described in the solicitation materials;
    - (c) The District has abused its discretion in rejecting the protestor's proposal as non-responsive; or
    - (d) The District's evaluation of proposals or the District's subsequent determination of Award is otherwise in violation of the District's Public Contracting Rules or the Public Contracting Code.
- B A protest of award:
- (1) Must be in writing.
  - (2) Must be physically received at the address below no later than 5:00 p.m. on the 7th calendar day from the date of the Notice of Intent to Award.

  - (4) Must specify the grounds for the protest including the specific citation of law, rule, regulation, or procedure upon which the protest is based. The judgment used in scoring by individual evaluators is not a ground for protest of award. An issue that could have been raised by request for change, clarification, or protest of the

solicitation pursuant to #17 of this RFP is not a ground for protest of award.

### REVISIONS TO DRAWINGS

**REVISION 2** – C1.00 SITE DEMOLITION, NOTE 6: Backstop mounted speakers (4). Coordinate with district representative to field test existing system and note condition. Remove all speakers and store in protected location. Include provisions to remount on new poles per district representative's direction.

**REVISION 3** – C1.00 SITE DEMOLITION, NOTE 5: Cut the 2 backstop poles nearest to the dugouts at 8' and cap. Preserve existing chain link fence between this pole and the dugout structure. Ensure closure to field of play with netting.



**REVISION 4** – C1.00 EXISTING CONDITIONS, NOTE 13: Preserve and protect existing bleachers in area shown on drawing. Access to areas of construction will take place from the field side. If impact is necessary, contractor responsible to disassemble and reassemble to preconstruction conditions.

**REVISION 6** – 31 10 00 SITE CLEARING, 3.00, C, 1, c: To protect against heavy and larger sized vehicle circulation, a layer of 1" thick plywood must be placed over a layer of Mirafi 140N geotextile fabric covering the field in all areas where

vehicles are required. Place construction grade steel crossing plates on top of plywood sheets overlapping 4 plywood sheets below with each steel plate. Groom field after removal.

**REVISION 7** – 01 11 00 SUMMARY OF WORK, 1.07, C, 8, a. All contractors working on site are to be fully vaccinated according to Oregon Health Authority Public Health Division chapter OAR 333-019-1030.

[OAR 333-019-1030](#) continues to be in effect, and **applies to anyone** who is employed by, or volunteers in, a public school, private school, parochial school, or charter school, alternative educational program or school-based program or **who is not employed but otherwise engaged to provide goods or services to a school or school-based program through any formal or informal agreement, whether compensated or uncompensated,** and includes but is not limited to teachers, administrative staff, coaches, drivers, and volunteers. This rule **applies to before/after school programs located at schools.** Short-term visitors or individuals making deliveries are not subject to this rule. Individuals whose job or volunteer work never includes direct or indirect contact with students or children at the school are not covered by this rule.
