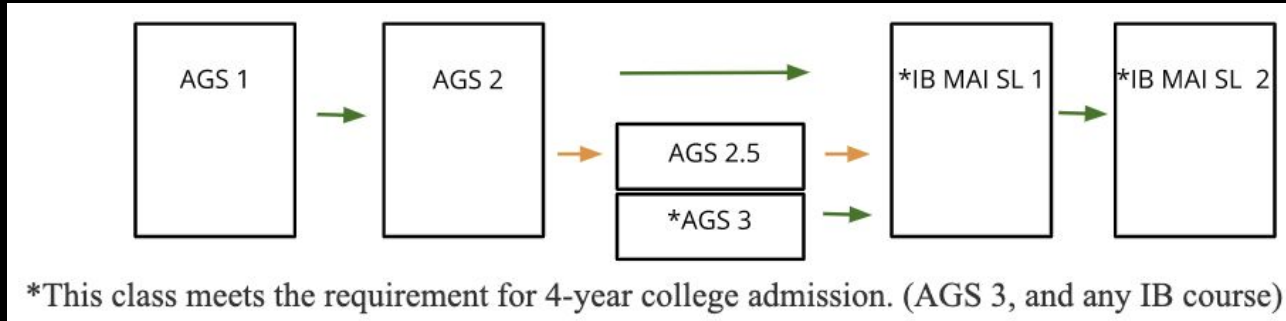

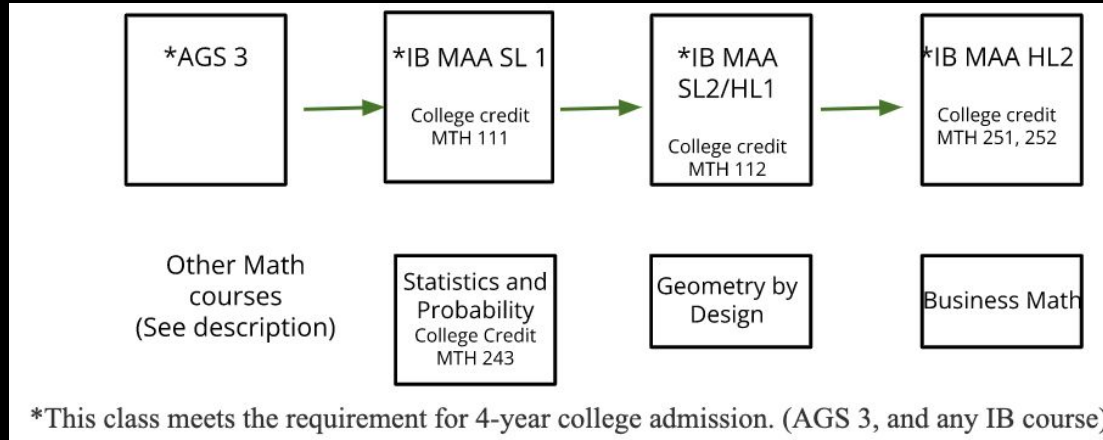
## Notes:

# New Courses for 2023-2024

## **IB Math Applications & Interpretations SL 1 (IB MAI SL 1)**

**Grades:** 10-12

**Graduation Requirement:** MA, EL

**Prerequisite:** AGS 2

**Credit:** 1.0

**Honors:** Y

**\*International Baccalaureate\***

This is a course of study over the last two years in high school for students who have completed AGS2. This course will prepare students for the Oregon State Math Test (OSAS), SAT and ACT and is a good fit for students interested in a Bachelor of Arts in their later years. Students will need to complete the second year of IB Math Applications SL 2 before they are eligible to take the IB Mathematics Applications and Interpretations SL Exam in May. 12th grade students who complete IB MAI SL1 may not be eligible to sit for the IB exam. This course prepares students to meet Oregon University System (OUS) entrance requirements. This course is designed to prepare students for a Standard level IB Applications math test. During this first year students will study topics that include: arithmetic and geometric sequences, linear, quadratic, polynomial, exponential, logarithmic, trigonometric and rational functions. The second year will continue to study the above and further study trigonometry and some basic calculus.

## **Personal & Academic Wellness**

**Grades:** 10-12

**Graduation Requirement:** EL

**Prerequisite:** Enrolled in an Advanced or IB course

**Credit:** .5

**Honors:** N

This course is designed to provide academic and personal support to students who are enrolled in 1 or more advanced classes at TuHS. This class will focus on strengthening academic skills like personal organization and time-management, as well as supporting students' mental health and well-being through activities that help reduce stress and anxiety. We will focus on personal strategies to build resilience and maintain a healthy mind-body balance, as well as contributing to the school community through a school-based service project.
